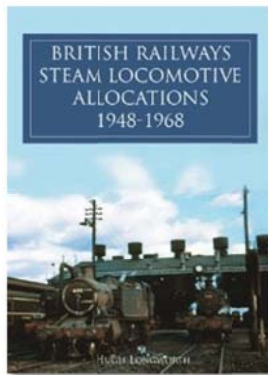


## New From The Shop September 2011

## New Books for September 2011

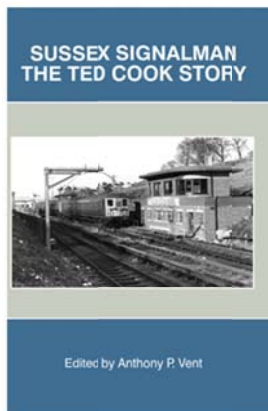


### **British Railways Steam Locomotive Allocations 1948-1968**

A comprehensive companion volume to Hugh Longworth's *British Railways Steam Locomotives 1948-1968*, this latest title provides a locomotive-by-locomotive allocation record from 1948 to 1963. The follow up to one of the most successful of reference books produced by Ian Allan Publishing's OPC imprint in recent years, this book provides a class-by-class, locomotive-by-locomotive record of each steam locomotive that was in service on 1 January 1948 as well as all those that were built between that date and 1963. Following years of continued research, this title is fully updated with any extra information found since the original book. Drawing upon six vital years in the steam era 1948, 1951, 1954, 1957, 1960 and 1963, the book provides a locomotive-by-locomotive allocation record, as well as including distribution maps to illustrate how each individual class was allocated during the relevant years and a shed-by-shed listing for each of these years.

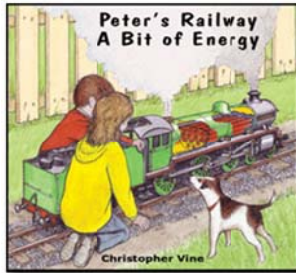

Following the true Compendium format, each class of DMU is profiled on one page, including a brief commentary, a table of key facts and dimensions, accompanied by a large picture of the standard version of the class, and pictures of all significant variations.

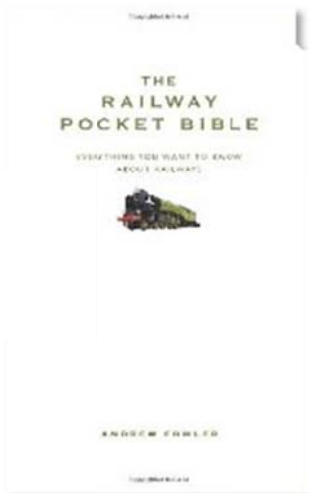


### Peter's Railway A Bit of Energy

A little technical book, suitable for ages 6-12 years.

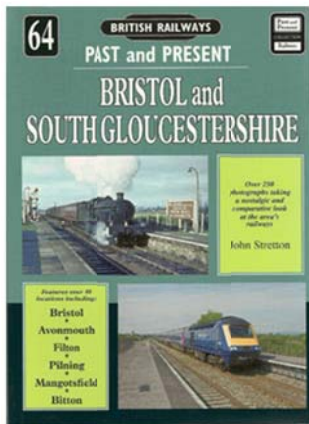

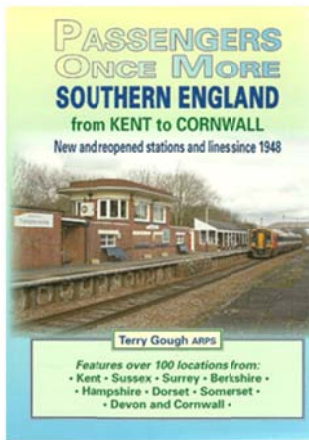

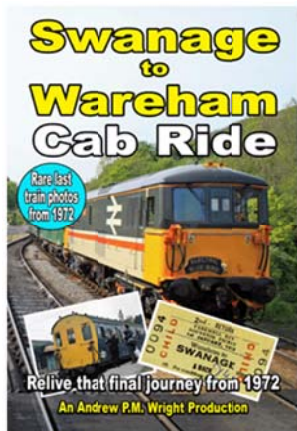


### Passengers Once More Southern England Kent to Cornwall

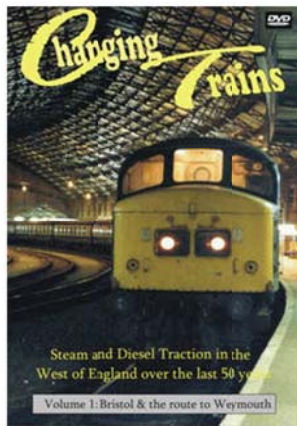


### Swanage to Wareham Cab Ride

### Changing Trains: Bristol to Weymouth

In 1960 many trains on the Western Region were still hauled by elderly steam locomotives, though titled trains and high speed schedules were still commonplace.

Within 5 years, the diesel invasion was all but complete. However, the culprits - a fleet of stylish diesel-hydraulics, and other first generation diesel types, still provided a fascinating scene for the enthusiast.

This programme includes rare cine film to illustrate the change on the motive power front in this area of the country over a period spanning more than 50 years.

### London Orbital

This DVD comprises two fascinating cab rides from the mid-1990's around London's complex rail network. The first is from Hoo Junction to Temple Mills and the second is from Clapham Junction to Temple Mills. Both journeys were not possible by passenger train and were therefore filmed on freight trains - Mainline Freight's 7L07 infrastructure service. The views from the locomotive footplates include manual signal boxes and semaphore signals that have since disappeared, as well as the sites of some of the capital's closed stations and freight terminals. Both of London's last surviving heritage DMU services are also seen, as are several of the capital's 'freight only' routes.
